Dear Ms. McGovern:

The State Bar's Office of Chief Trial Counsel has reviewed your complaint against Diana Becton to determine whether there are sufficient grounds to prosecute a possible violation of the State Bar Act and/or Rules of Professional Conduct.

In your complaint, you allege Ms. Becton, and the District Attorney's Office of Contra Costa County, are violating your rights. You filed a complaint against Paul Holes on September 21, 2019 with Ms. Becton's office regarding statements he made, or statements others made based on Mr. Holes' statements, in a request against you for a restraining order. Your complaint against Paul Holes also alleged he either participated or has knowledge of a March 1, 2018 attack and email hack in your home.

On January 14, 2019, Spencer Gordon filed an ex parte request for a temporary restraining order: *Gordon v. McGovern*, Case No. 19VER000086, filed in Los Angeles County Superior Court. You explain Judge Fidaus Dordi granted the temporary restraining order and Judge Michael American ultimately granted a five year restraining order against you. While you also allege Peter Clemente and Jim Clemente also obtained a restraining order, you did not provide any court documents naming those parties. You generally allege Mr. Holes and others made fraudulent statements to support the restraining order against you.

You allege Ms. Becton's office refuses to respond to your complaint.
